Toxic Substances Control Act of 1976 (TSCA)

The new U.S. regulations published on January 6th, 2021 Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) per Toxic Substances Control Act of 1976 (TSCA) Section 6(h), are to restrict the import and use of five chemicals into the United States.

To implement the law, the EPA has published a list of chemicals suspected of being carcinogenic or reproductively toxic.

These are the following substances:

Phenol, isopropylated phosphate (3:1) (PIP 3:1)
Decabromodiphenyl ether (DecaBDE)
2,4,6-tri-tert-butylphenol (2,4,6 TTBP)
Hexachlorobutadiene (HCBD)
Pentachlorothiophenol (PCTP)

These pollutants listed above are not present in ROSE-standard products and are not used.
